#### **First Time Here?**

## 4 Women You Should Know

In our *Giants* teaching series, we barely scratched the surface of the spiritual giants that serve as our mentors, and inspire us in our own Christian walk. Even more, there are a lot more women that rarely get the time or attention that they deserve. As a result, here are four additional women to explore on your own.

- I. Corrie Ten Boom Known for her book *The Hiding Place*, Ten Boom recounts how she and her family hid Jewish refugees in their home during World War II. While her family was caught and would die in various concentration camps, it was Ten Boom who survived, and after the war, amazingly preached a message of forgiveness and reconciliation.
- 2. Fanny Crosby While Crosby never preached from the pulpit, her impact on the church is undeniable. Blind from infancy, that didn't stop her from writing some 8,000 hymns, many of which you have probably sung. Her most famous hymn might be "Blessed Assurance."
- 3. Rosa Parks Yes, we know about the Rosa Parks who courageously chose to stand her ground while on the bus, and as a result, is known as the "Mother of the Civil Rights Movement." But most of us are less knowledgeable about her life after this moment. What follows is equally compelling. You can read more about Parks in her book Quiet Strength.
- 4. Mother Theresa I know, you already know who Mother Theresa is. However, most of us probably don't know the whole story behind why she has come to be known as a measure of holiness and compassion to so many around the world. Perhaps a brief reading of her story in Eric Metaxes's book, 7 Women, would do you well and offer you a more well-rounded understanding of this incredible woman.
