September Facts

September is a unique month, as it's made up of the last days of summer and the first days of the fall. It's also known as the "harvest month" — the time to gather up the harvest of things planted in the spring and prepare for the winter months. Here are some more fun and not-so-fun facts about this month:

- September is National Happy Cat Month. It also consists of a number of other noteworthy days. Sept. 11 is National Hug Your Hound Day; Sept. 13 is Kids Take Over the Kitchen Day; Sept. 19 is International Talk Like A Pirate Day; and Sept. 24 is National Punctuation Day.
- 2. September was originally named "Septem" as it was the "seventh month" of the Roman Calendar. It wasn't until 451 BC that the months of January and February were added to the calendar, making September the ninth month.
- 3. The Romans love to associate different gods with the months of the calendar. The month of September is associated with Vulcan, the Roman god of fire, which might be attributed to its extremely hot temperatures back when it was the seventh month of the year.
- 4. September only has one birthstone, but this one is impressive. It's the sapphire and its deep blue tones. Relatedly, the sapphire was once worn to protect the wearer from both the threat of poisoning and to ward off other evils.
- 5. September is also known for some historically bad and horrific days. On Sept. 1, 1939, Hitler invaded Poland, which would become the impetus for World War II. Then, on Sept. 11, 2001, the worst terrorist attack on US soil took place when four commercial airliners were hijacked, with two of them flying straight into the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center in New York City.
